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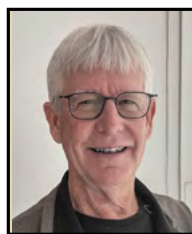
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The End of the Road

The Editor's Wind

As an artist, photographer and graphic designer I am very excited! I have recently implemented a powerful and versatile new tool in the production of the Coastalaire.

You may remember the image of the blue cabriolet with the vanity plate BIGSUR appearing to drive north on Highway One that was on page 6 in the Prez's Corner of the December issue. That is not a photograph. I created that image completely with highly detailed word prompts in an Artificial Intelligence engine. Basically, AI is a super computer that collects and stores enormous amounts of data, and with that data it "intelligently" reasons a solution to a problem given from detailed and ordered instructions . . . I think.

Some of you may be cringing. I know some of my photography friends are wrinkling their noses and shaking their heads. A friend of mine calls it a million "rabbit holes". But like drones, AI is here to stay and with ever rapidly increasing influence. Some fear it may replace us before we delete ourselves. Regardless, its progress is exponential, and our interaction with everything will change remarkably

AI images may begin as photographs, but I'm not using photographic prompts. I'm creating images that may look like photographs simply by inputting very carefully chosen and highly detailed word prompts. The more specific and accurate my prompts, the more likely the resulting image will look like my vision. If I'm not happy with the result, I reword and/or add to the prompts. The image on page 6 in the December issue of Coastalaire required only two scripts. I was surprised that AI, without prompts, included the double yellow lines and the reflecting lane markers as if it had driven Highway One at some time and noted those details. I was pleased with that.

The image on the cover of this issue required several specifically ammended prompts to get the image I wanted. Some of "AI's" solutions had Santa's hand turned backwards. It doesn't yet know the correct orientation of parts of the subject. But the more I work with it, the more it learns and the more I understand how to direct it. It does take a level of "skill", and nothing can be taken for granted.

My prompts had to describe almost every detail including the depth of the snow, the details of the cabin, the trees, the smoke from the chimney, the color and year and model of the Porsche. I had to describe all of the lighting including the light from under the car and the light from the windows of the cabin.

Now, for those of you who may feel disappointed and skeptical about the authenticity of the future Coastalaires, here's my promise. Anytime I use AI in the Coastalaire, I will clearly identify it for you. Photographs will remain properly credited as photographs. And AI images will be clearly identified. In some ways they are sorta like cartoons, just posing as photographs.

Hence, the image above and the cover page on this issue of Coastalaire are noted noted as an image created by AI from my word prompts.

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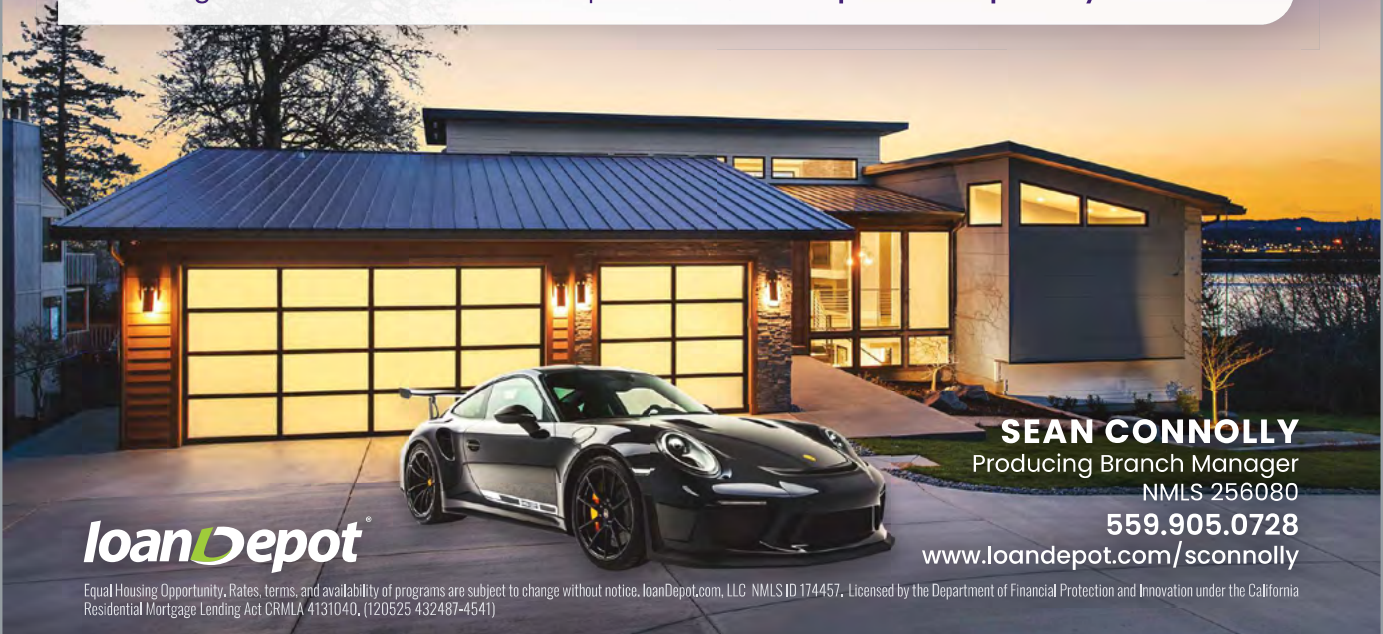

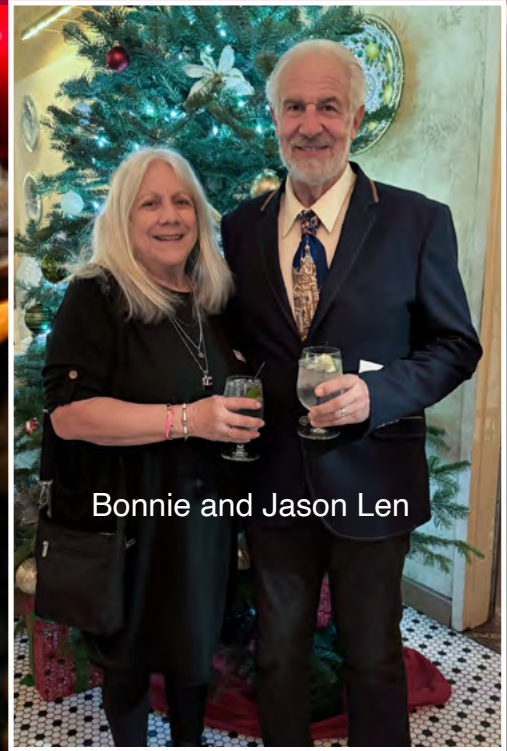

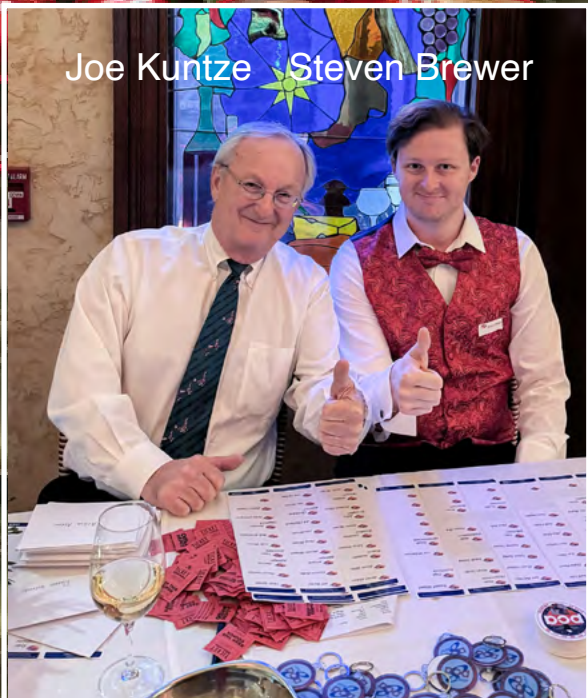

California Central Coast Region will kick off the Drivers Education series on May 1st at Buttonwillow Raceway on the Classic Course. We will run the full course, Track #1 counter clockwise, this time out. The Golden Gate Region will be there on the 2nd and 3rd, spend a couple, or even 3 days on the track to get the season rolling.

Our next date will be at the iconic Laguna Seca Raceway on June 29th. This is a 92db day. We tried for 103db and even 105db, but without success. Put your offset pipes on, and join us for a fantastic day on this great track.

We will have the Taste of the Track sessions and the popular noon time Parade Lap available for both DE days. We may even have an organized drive on the way to the track.

The third track day is not scheduled at this time. The third DE will depend on the support we have for the first two DE dates. The tracks are raising prices every year. Laguna Seca raised the price for one track day by 30% over last year. We had diminished attendance last year compared to previous years. Due to the costs of the tracks, we want to be a little cautious with track rentals until we know how well attended the first two DE events are.
