

CCCR/PCA Meeting Notes

October 1, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 5:01 PM at Porsche SLO.

Our Board:

Attending were Joe Shubitowski, Andy Winterbottom, Mark Schilling, Chuck Jennings, Jeff Bartel, Sanja Brewer, Scot Burns, Joe Kuntze, Bob Bruington, Fred Herr and Carol Walker. Bill Chadwick and Gil Igleheart were absent. Tony Brizzolarra was a guest.

President: Joe Shubitowski missed the President's meeting last month. The new member barbecue hosted 172 people who gave a lot of good feedback. There was some discussion about whether we continue on to subsidize it? There were pros and cons. Thirty two new members attended. In the future, we need trash cans and cases of water. We decided not to hold future DE events on November 1 as it interferes with the Halloween festivities.

Tony Brizzolarra told us about the exhilarating outing to the Porsche Experience Center he and Joe Shubitowski attended. They drove a GT3 with an instructor on a hot lap. The Cal Poly racing team attended the last Cars and Coffee. KSBY came to showcase them. Cars they race are all electric.

Vice President: Sanja passed out the menu for the Holiday Party, which will be \$100 per person with a cap of 120 people. There will be no band, no room fee, and a no host bar. Registration will go on MSR as soon as this week.

Secretary: The September notes were emailed. The Porsche crest is to be deleted on the notes per National. Sanja moved to approve the notes, Bob Bruington seconded and all approved.

Treasurer: Bill Chadwick was absent but sent his report via email. Our balance was \$43,049 at the beginning of 2025 and now it is \$49,355. Andy moved to accept his report, Jeff seconded, and all approved.

Membership: Andy Winterbottom reported there were 15 new members, three transfers in, zero transfer out, twelve lapsed, and five test drives. There are 542 primary members and 325 affiliates, to total 867 members. Nationally, there are 167,359 members. New members names were announced.

Activities: Joe Kuntze reported the drive to King City and gimmick rally on October 11 has 16 cars with 25 people signed up. The weather will be in the 70's. He needs waivers, a safety car, and sweep. Chuck will be at King City to

set up. At the start in San Miguel, he will give clear directions that will warn drivers about blind hills and corners and other obstacles.

October 18 is the Oktoberfest at Paso Robles Brewing Company

November 8 is a drive up to Atascadero for a wine class at the Central Coast School of Wine.

November 15 is the Andy Winterbottom run up Highway 1 to the barriers with lunch in Cambria after at Mimosas.

December 7 is the Holiday Party at Cafe Roma.

December 13 is the Christmas gag gift party.

Potentially, Big Willow will be the third venue. Next year will be Bob's last year as DE organizer and director, but he wants to stay on the board.

Autocross: Fred Herr reminded us the last autocross is October 25, and it is half full. They will open it to non-members next week.

Newsletter: Chuck Jennings has the October newsletter 90% completed. He needs a digital copy of the new members names and the Holiday Party menu. This is a print issue and the digital copy will post on October 13. Yesterday was the 70th anniversary of James Dean's death and he will include an article pertaining to that accident.

Website: Scot Burns got contacted on the website by someone who was concerned about Porsches driving recklessly through a neighborhood at night and he tactfully assured him it was not our club. He is changing the name of board "minutes" to "notes" on the website. Attitude Home Loans ad is up on the site. There were 14,000 total page views, 6,000 visitors, the majority are on desktops. Viewers keep growing.
